Thematic Studies Themes A,B,D,F</p> <p>Style(s) of question: Multiple choice 1 mark, 2 marks, 4 marks, 5 marks and 12 mark questions in both papers.</p>		<p>How best to revise for this subject: (activities, how long, when, revisiting ideas ...)</p> <p>Start early with answering exam questions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Look through your revision guide and text books and find the chapters/pages • Check your notes and revision guide for the key understandings. • Check Key Vocabulary using the lists at the front of your ex books • Make notes/flash cards • Practice the exam questions in the middle of your revision guide <p>Identify which topics you are finding tricky. Focus on these by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • use GCSE Pod • making flashcards for key points and vocabulary you find difficult. • Use your revision guide and highlight key areas/vocabulary • Practice past papers including ones in the revision guide for Paper 1 and 2 • Ben Wardle RS teacher revision videos • Answer questions at the end of the chapters – Islam and Christianity texts.
